- Office of Housing Counseling;

In Kentucky, HUD provides four major kinds of rental housing assistance to the elderly, to persons with disabilities, to individuals, and to families:


- Public Housing

HUD, along with many other federal agencies fund Homeless Assistance Agencies.



BUYING A HOME

HUD's FHA has mortgage insurance for 1- to 4-unit homes. There are no income limits, but there are Mortgage Limits by County/MSA.

FHA Lenders provide the loans -

- Basic Mortgage 3.5% downpayment
- Rehab Mortgage finances purchase and repairs
- Energy Efficient Mortgage finances purchase and energy improvements

HOME REPAIRS

HUD has several programs to help homeowners with home repairs and rehabilitation:

HOME and Community Development Block Grant programs (Income Limits Apply)


HECM (62 and older) is an FHA reverse mortgage that does not have to be paid back as long as the borrower lives in the home

FHA 203(k) Rehabilitation Mortgage finances both the purchase (or balance of mortgage) and repairs to a property

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

HUD provides annual funding to both local communities and to the Commonwealth of Kentucky for:

- Community Development
- Rental Housing
- Home Repairs
- Homeownership
- Economic Development

(HUD and Community Action Agencies)





HUD residents lack strategic opportunities to enter the construction industry with paid training.

The Department of Energy recently received an additional \$3.5 billion from the Infrastructure Investment Jobs Act.


Community Action Agencies need entry-level workers to retrofit homes and lower the costs of energy in low-income communities.
